The Greek Theatre

Almost every Greek city had a theatre because plays were part of many religious festivals. The Greeks enjoyed singing and dancing. At first, theatres were only used for this kind of festivals.

The theatres were built on hillsides in the open air and could often hold more than 18,000 spectators. They were built in a semi-circular shape with rows of tiered stone seating around it. The shape of the theatres gave everyone in the audience excellent viewing and also meant they could hear the actors well too. In the centre of the theatre was a circular dancing floor (orchestra), with an altar for sacrifices dedicated to Dionysus. The stage was a raised area within this circle.

All the actors were strictly male. They wore large masks that exaggerated their facial features and emotions and they were dressed in similarly exaggerated clothes. The mouth hole of the mask was large to help amplify the voices. Greek plays were either comedies or tragedies. Tragedies were often about the past, whereas comedies tended to be about current and everyday life. Tragedy was in reality the negative image of comedy. Tragedy showed the end of a powerful hero. Costumes were different, for example actors in comedies wore bright colours while in tragedies they wore dark colours. Plays were either spoken or sung in rhyme.

ATMs are absolutely everywhere nowadays; people use these cash machines without a second thought. The possibility that something could go wrong has never crossed most people's minds.

Unfortunately, nowadays, things are not always as they seem at the ATM. Most ATM scams involve criminal theft of debit card numbers and personal identification numbers (PINs) from the innocent users of these machines. ATM theft usually involves the innocent cooperation of the cardholders themselves. The first step in avoiding these traps is to understand them. Let's look at the most common ways people get robbed at ATMs.

One trick involves sticking a false façade over the ATM machine. Though the machine looks normal, in reality this façade will 'eat' your card and then show you an error message on the screen. Your PIN is usually recorded by a hidden camera, or in some cases, by a 'helpful' person standing nearby who suggests that you try to enter your PIN again. Of course, this person is actually a criminal, and moments after you leave, he or she will take your card from the false front of the ATM and walk away with both your card and the access code. All this applies to ATMs in areas such as airport terminals and self-service petrol stations.

There are lots of ways to exercise, but running is one of the easiest to start. It also has lots of advantages. Firstly, almost anybody can do it and it is one of the best ways to exercise. Besides it being good for your well-being, running along a beach or through a forest gives you time to think and, importantly, to get you back to nature.

Almost anybody can take up running, but talk to your doctor first if you are over 60 or if you are recovering from illness. Otherwise, anybody who is able of walking for 15 minutes can do it. Don't worry too much about how fit you are. Most people who begin running aren't fit; that's why they take it up in the first place. Start off slowly, and you will quickly see improvement. You won't even need much equipment to get started: a pair of shoes, a pair of shorts, a shirt and you're ready.

Fewer than 10 per cent of all runners ever run a marathon, and most of those who do run one never do it again. If you're happy with 5km or 10km, that's fine, and there will be plenty of competitive events to enter if you want to.

Your first run will be the hardest. You will feel more confident if you start off in a group or with a friend, and it will help to keep you motivated. If it is hard to find a partner, you can join a running club, and there are plenty of them up around.

After your first run, make sure you warm down properly by walking around, and this will help your muscles. The morning after your first run you will experience aches and pains. There isn't much you can do about them, but as your muscles get stronger, they learn to cope with the new conditions. So don't worry about the pain. Next time it won't be so bad and soon you won't even notice it.

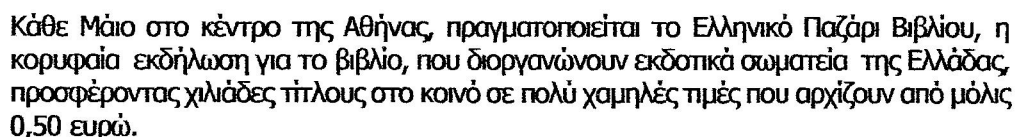
