COUNTABLE NOUNS

Countable nouns refer to things that can be counted. They have singular and plural forms.

> example: one apple / four apples

UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

Uncountable nouns refer to things that CAN'T be counted.

EXAMPLE:

paint

bread

water

rice

AFEW VS

a few

We use 'a few' with plural countable nouns.

Example 1:

There are a few bottles on the table.

Example 2:

l will meet a few friends for lunch today..

a little

We use 'a little' with uncountable nouns.

Example 1:

There is a little milk left in the fridge.

Example 2:

I ate a little bread for breakfast.







a few or a little? There are cookies in the cupboard.



a few or a little? There are (a few) cookies in the cupboard.



a few or a little? read () books at the weekend.



a few or a little? l read (a few) books at the weekend.



l spilled () water on my dress.



l spilled (a little) water on my dress.



I have () pencils in my bag.



l have (a few) pencils in my bag.



a few or a little? There is still (time left to study for the exam.



a few or a little? There is still (a little) time left to study for the exam.
